# 1. General Information

## 1.1. Governance

The Badminton competition will be conducted under the Laws of Badminton and Competition Regulations of the Badminton UAE Federation and the BWF. The competition will also conform to the requirements of the International Masters Games Association, or as otherwise specified in this document.

## 1.2. Eligibility


In line with the sport-specific rules, an athlete must compete in their designated age group, with your age determined as of 31 December 2026. For example, if you turn 40 by 31 December 2026, you will compete in the 40-44 age category. The age of the youngest player will determine the age category.

\*Mixed Doubles means a male and female in one team. Teams entering mixed doubles with same gender pairings will be considered ineligible. There will be no guarantee that the team can be placed in a single gender doubles event after the deadline.

- **Competitive** – For elite players who have competed at an international or national team/individual level and for national, state or provincial master’s champions.
- **Recreational** - For players who play in non-competitive or lower-grade club leagues, as well as social and casual players.

## Para Classification

The OMGAD2026 will offer national classification opportunities in the days prior to the start of the competition. International Classifiers will be available for the following impairment:

- PI: Physical Impairment
- Only Athletes with 'New' sport class status must undergo national classification on site and must bring all relevant medical documentation (In ENGLISH).
- Athletes will need to present themselves for classification at the date and time designated by the sport. As a result, the classification outcomes will not be officially recognized by the respective International Federations.

Eligible Sport Class:

- Wheelchair Sport Classes – WH 1 and WH 2
- Standing Sport Classes – SL 3, SL 4 and SU 5
- Short Stature Sport Class – SH 6

Sport Class Status:

Eligible sport class status to participate in the Games are as follows:

- N = New
- R = Review
- FRD = Fixed Review Date
- C = Confirmed

## 2.2. Format

- Participants may enter a maximum of three events. The three events can be any combination of singles, doubles and mixed doubles.
- Participants playing in Singles and Doubles must play in the same grade division: Competitive or Recreational.
- The Badminton competition for individual events is dependent on the number of registrations.
- Round robin (pool play) preliminary rounds will be held.

- Where there is more than one pool, these pools will determine the placings for knockout rounds for medals.
- Players can expect to compete in a minimum of two matches per event.
- If the players in a doubles pair are in different age categories, the pair must play in the younger age category.
- Players entering doubles or mixed doubles events must enter the division of the higher-level player in the pair.
- Individuals and pairs will be allocated to the division entered; however, the OMGAD reserves the right to re-grade Participants. Players who are re-graded will be advised by OMGAD prior to draws being done.
- Participants do not have to play in the same age group for all events (i.e. can play in 40+ singles, 35+ doubles as they have a younger partner and 40+ doubles with a different partner).

### **2.3. Determining Places**

The following process will be used to determine pool placings:

- Match difference
- Head-to-head
- Points difference
- Drawing lots

### **2.4. Schedule**

- The OMGAD shall post the schedule two weeks prior to the start of the competition on the Games website and each day of competition at the venue and on the website.
- It will be the responsibility of all participants to ensure they have checked the draws and are available to play at the scheduled time and location.
- It is anticipated that the competition will start at 0900hrs and continue to approximately 2100hrs each competition day.

### **2.5. Rules**

- Players who are not present when called upon to play any match shall forfeit the match and a walkover shall be awarded to the opposing players/pairs.



- Matches may be called up to 10 minutes prior to the scheduled match time.
- Players are entitled to a minimum rest time of 30 minutes between matches.

## 2.6 Scoring

- All matches will be played as per the current Badminton World Federation (B.W.F) scoring system.
- All matches will be the best of three games to 15 points, with extension until 21, when the winner shall be the side winning the 21st point.

## 2.7. Substitutions and Withdrawals

- A player may participate in an Individual event of the Badminton competition only if the player enters by the closing date for registrations. After the closing date for registrations, a player who has entered and is then unable to take part through illness, injury or any other unavoidable cause, may be substituted by another registered player providing that the rules for age category and grade are followed, and that it is in line with the OMGAD participation terms and conditions.
- All results of any player/pair that has been disqualified or withdraws before completing the group matches shall be entirely deleted.
- A 'no-show' for a match will be treated as a withdrawal.
- The BWF GCR regulations 25 regarding player withdrawals do not apply to this event. I.e. If a player withdraws from one event they may still participate in another event.

## 2.8. Appeals and Protests

- There will be no field-of-play appeals. The decision of the Referee on all interpretations of the Laws of Badminton shall be final.
- Any appeals, protests and disputes regarding the Tournament Rules must be lodged in writing to the Tournament Organiser prior to the commencement of the competition.
- The Referee in conjunction with the Disputes Committee shall determine all appeals, protests and disputes in relation to the Tournament Rules.
- The Disputes Committee shall consist of the Referee (or his/her deputy), the Competition Manager (or his/her nominee) and one independent player.

## 3. Technical Details

### 3.1. Technical Delegate

The Technical Delegate, who will be endorsed by the UAE Badminton Federation, will oversee the implementation of all sport specific rules and requirements at the Games.

## 4. Equipment & Uniform

### 3.1. Equipment

- Participants are to provide their own racquets.
- OMGAD will provide courts and associated equipment to competition standard.
- It is the responsibility of everyone to bring training/warm up shuttlecocks.
- On-site restringing services will be provided at both competition venues on a user-pays basis. Cost to be confirmed in the final version of the competition guide.

### 3.2. Uniform

- Acceptable Badminton sports clothing must be worn while playing.
- It is not mandatory for partners to wear the same design/colour clothing during individual events, although it is preferable.
- All Badminton participants, officials and volunteers must wear shoes with non-marking soles whilst on the competition area of the venue (field of play).

## 5. Awarding

### 5.1. Medals

The top 3 athletes will be awarded the gold medal, silver medal and bronze medal respectively.



## 5.2. Ceremonies

- In OMGAD 2026, athletes are individuals and represent themselves. National flags and anthems will not be included in medal ceremonies.
- The medal ceremony will be held after each final.
- The medal ceremony will be conducted in Arabic and English.

## 6. Protests and Appeals

### 6.1. Protests

- Competition-related disputes and protests shall be handled according to rules and related regulations of the international association of the sport. If there are no rules regarding such disputes and protests in place, the competitor may first make verbal protest and submit written protest to OMGAD within 30 minutes after the end of a contest.
- No protest can be lodged by any team members or staff against a judging (scoring) decision during the competition period.

### 6.2. Appeals

- Based on the principle of trust, the Organizer will not take the initiative to review the grade of athletes upon registration. Matters regarding athlete qualifications and grades should be submitted to the Organizer with relevant supporting materials before the Games or when the fact occurs. The complaint will be handled in accordance with the rules and relevant regulations of international sports federations and relevant regulations.
- Applications that are not submitted within the stipulated time or with incomplete materials will not be accepted.

## 7. Updates
